Israel's enemies demand FBI investigation for journalist Akleh shooting: "A slap in the face"

Dear Friend of Israel, Friend of FLAME:

You've no doubt heard that the FBI just announced it is beginning an investigation of Israel for Al Jazeera journalist Shireen Abu Akleh's death during a firefight between Palestinian fighters resisting arrest and Israeli Defense Forces (IDF) last May.

That's strange, since in investigations already completed by both Palestinian and Israeli forensic experts (with U.S. oversight), neither was able positively to determine the source of the bullet that killed Akleh. Furthermore, zero evidence has been offered that Akleh's death was intentional.

The move signals clearly either that the U.S. does not trust the results of examiners who evaluated the incident—or that enemies of Israel in the government simply want to malign the Jewish state.

Israel's Prime Minister, Yair Lapid, has called the investigation a "grave mistake." A *Jerusalem Post* house op-ed called it "a slap in the face for Israel."

The superfluous FBI investigation appears to be at the behest of letters sent to the FBI by 57 Democratic Representatives and to President Biden by 22 Democratic Senators (plus two independents, including Bernie Sanders).

In response to the insult, Israel has indicated it will not cooperate with the investigation. Many in Israel consider the U.S. action an attempt to demonize the Jewish state with no evidence and a clear application of double standards—both markers of antisemitism.

In any case, the FBI probe seems a clear attempt to discredit the Jewish state in the absence of any hard facts—and the impossibility of ever *acquiring* dispositive evidence.

Shortly after the incident, Akleh's employer, Al Jazeera accused IDF soldiers of

Democracy Thrives in Israel

A new report ranks the Jewish state as one of the world's strongest, most equitable democracies—despite baseless falsehoods about its oppression of Palestinians

While enemies accuse Israel of apartheid, genocide, and rights violations, they offer little convincing evidence. In the contrary, Israel has a superior record of civil liberties, elections, rule of law and other opportunities of civil society, ranking it the world's 24th most successful democracy.

What are the facts?

Israel's national independence for its alleged treatment of Arab Israeli citizens, as well as Palestinian Arabs living in surrounding disputed territories, is in stark contrast to such poorly represented countries, for example, Turkey (ranked 100th), the U.S. (the Economist Intelligence Unit ranks Israel as one of the most thriving democracies in the world, scoring higher than the United States, Spain, Italy and some 19 other nations). The index ranks countries according to 15 criteria, covering each nation's performance according to its 1) electoral process and pluralism, 2) functioning of government, 3) political participation, 4) political culture and 5) civil liberties.

Israel's 2021 ranking shows consistent improvement in its democratic processes

compared with the first such report in 2006, when the Jewish state ranked only 47th. In the current report, Israel was ranked for its achievements as an Arab party to today's ruling government coalition.

No surprise, since Israel's vibrant democracy has a vibrant elected tradition, stable governing institutions, high political participation among its citizens, a vigorous, even business political culture, and broad equal civil liberties for all its citizens.

Unfortunately, even as Israel's democracy improved in the past year, the EU's record for democracy globally, usually and since, they ignore the fact that the Oslo Accords gave governance responsibilities of Palestinians in those territories directly to their respective counterparts—the Palestinian Authority and Hamas.

In contrast to Israel news Middle Eastern reporting, the highest ranking of which was Tunisia, ranking only 74th there, and the rest of us as democracy, but as "hybrid regimes" the territory of Palestine was ranked as an "authoritarian" regime in 1980s class.

Like all countries in the index, Israel's performance in the EU's evaluation was based on the health and performance of democratic institutions among its citizens.

While critics often unfairly blame Israel for a lack of democratic freedoms in Judea and Samaria ("the West Bank") and Gaza, they ignore the fact that the Oslo Accords gave governance responsibilities of Palestinians in those territories directly to their respective counterparts—the Palestinian Authority and Hamas.

Unfortunately, neither of these Palestinian governments holds legitimate elections, respects human civil liberties, nor does it have a legitimate claim to the land.

Jewish values help guarantee Israel's democracy

State, too, that while the nation-state law declares Hebrew to be the national language, this is not different than in the United States, in which English is the mother tongue. Nor does Israel's nation-state law establish any official religion—unlike some seven European countries that declare state religions to their very constitutions.

In short, Israel has a proud record of the Jewish people while still cherishing and improving one of the most ethically diverse and free democracies on earth. In fact, some would argue that it is precisely Jewish values of compassion and justice that help Israel and help guarantee Israel's vibrant democracy. No matter which standards accurately Israel's success implies, the Jewish state obviously remains one of the strongest and most successful democracies on earth, providing political freedom and economic opportunity consistent with the majority of the world's nations. Moreover, the suffering and plight of the Palestinians has little to do with Israel and is almost entirely the result of authoritarian governance by its corrupt elected representatives and their adherence to a racist policy.

having killed Akleh. However, neither Al Jazeera nor any other news outlet has produced definitive proof that Israel's troops killed her.

Al Jazeera is funded by the government of the small Arab state of Qatar, which opposes diplomatic relations with Israel. Qatar is also suspected of funding Palestinian terrorist groups like Hamas and Islamic Jihad.

When the independent investigation of the journalist's death was carried out by the IDF, in cooperation with the U.S., the Palestinians refused to cooperate. In fact, for several months the PA refused to hand over the bullet that killed Akleh to investigators, until American pressure persuaded them to hand it over to experts from the U.S. Justice Department.

Unfortunately, the bullet was damaged so badly that it was impossible to trace the gun that shot it. Thus, the head of Palestinian Forensic Medicine declared it was impossible to know who shot the bullet that killed Akleh.

The media inside PA-controlled territory were banned from talking about Akleh's death—not surprising, since credible ballistic experts indicated to legal advocate Shurat Hadin the high likelihood the deadly bullet came from a gun belonging to the Al Aqsa Martyrs' Brigade, armed henchmen of the Palestinian Fatah party .

The Al Aqsa Martyrs' Brigade has committed hundreds of murders and other attacks on Israeli civilians, especially in recent months. IDF forces were in Jenin on the morning of Akleh's death precisely to round up terrorists responsible for recent killings.

In short, any assertion that Israeli troops intentionally killed Al Jazeera journalist Shireen Abu Akleh is ludicrous. The Israeli military has strict rules of engagement that forbid targeting journalists. Israel has no history of intentionally killing journalists.

Furthermore, Israeli troops were 200 yards – two football fields – away from where Akleh was shot, making it highly unlikely that she could be identified as a member of the press.

Tragically, a cadre of Israel-unfriendly U.S. lawmakers has ignored all evidence and diplomatic respect, deciding instead to persecute America's most trusted ally in the Middle East and one of its strongest in the world.

Ask yourself: Why would the FBI conduct its own investigation into this matter— especially since the U.S. has never investigated any other allies when U.S. journalists have been killed? What precisely is the FBI trying to determine?

Since 1990, some 2,658 journalists have been killed—many in war zones, most murdered for their reporting. Fifteen American journalists have been killed this year in Ukraine alone. Where are the investigations?

Forty-nine Americans have been killed by Palestinian terrorists —intentionally —since August 9, 2001. No FBI investigations.

Indeed, the U.S. itself is guilty of killing journalists in combat zones. According

to the Committee to Protect Journalists, U.S. forces killed 13 journalists in Iraq. But of course, those were American forces, not Israelis. No FBI investigations.

One thing is clear: U.S. partisan members of Congress—and our supposedly *non-partisan* FBI—are using a double standard against Israel in the Akleh case—and that fits the definition of antisemitism like a glove.

Only Israel is singled out, because, per renowned legal scholar Alan Dershowitz, Israel is the Jew among nations.

I urge you in conversations with friends, colleagues and family—and in letters to the editor—to point out the unfair double-standard that U.S. Democratic lawmakers are applying to Israel. Explain that this double-standard is both a rude gesture to America's greatest ally in the Middle East, and a vile act of antisemitism.

Emphasize, too, that the FBI's unwarranted and unnecessary investigation only encourages the false narrative that Israel disrespects a free press—when in fact Israel is the only nation in the Middle East that has a free press.
